The competition will be held at **Desert Schools Coyotes Center** (previously Polar Ice, Peoria), located at 15829 N. 83rd Avenue, Peoria, AZ, 85382. The ice surface is indoors and measures 80' x 200' with slightly rounded corners.

The conduct of this competition will be in accordance with US Figure Skating rules governing non-qualifying competitions, except where noted in this announcement. All skating level and age requirements are as of the date of close of entries. The decision of the referee on all matters will be final. The referee, along with the competition chairperson, shall have the right to exclude any person whose behavior is unruly or unsportsmanlike.

ELIGIBILITY: Phoenix Fiesta Skate is open to all eligible US Figure Skating members, is sanctioned by US Figure Skating and is governed by the rules and regulations prescribed in the 2006-07 official US Figure Skating Rulebook. A current member is 1) a full club or individual member of US Figure Skating, or 2) has submitted an application to a US Figure Skating Club or to US Figure Skating for individual membership. Note: ISI members must also be US Figure Skating members to compete.

Events will be offered in:

Singles and Pairs

Dance, Solo Dance, and Dance-with-your-Coach
Showcase (Artistic) and Compulsory Moves

Skaters will not be seeded in this competition. Division of Juvenile through Senior events into Qualifying Round Groups will be by random draw. The number of qualifying groups and number of skaters advancing to the Final Round will be in accordance with Rule 3276. Qualifying Rounds for Intermediate, Novice, Junior and Senior levels will consist of the Short Program and Free Skate. Final rounds will consist of Free Skate only. We will be using the Short Program required elements and Free Skate well-balanced programs for the 2006-2007 season.

If there are more than 16 skaters entered in the Pre-Juvenile Free Skate event, the event will be divided by random draw into Qualifying Round Groups of no more than 10 skaters. There will be no final round for No-Test, Pre-Preliminary, or Preliminary Free Skate events. If there are more than 12 skaters entered for each of these levels, each level will be divided by random draw into Qualifying Round Groups of no more than 8 skaters. All skating durations will be in accordance with Rules 3640 through 4511, except where noted.

Previous first place winners in Phoenix Fiesta Skate categories *No-Test through Pre-Juvenile* must move up one level higher, regardless of test level status.

All Juvenile through Senior singles and pairs events require that a **Planned Program Content Form** be completed and submitted with the competition application. A copy of this form is attached to this announcement, and is also at www.usfigureskating.org/content/programcontentform.pdf. The Planned Program Content form for IJS level events MUST be included with your application. Applications received without the PPC form will be considered incomplete.

JUDGING: The closed system of judging will be used for all events. The IJS system will be used to judge all singles and pairs events in the Juvenile through Senior levels. The 6.0 system will be used to judge all Showcase, Dance, Adult, and No Test through Pre-Juvenile levels in singles and pairs.

FUTURE CHAMPIONS SERIES EVENTS: Juvenile, Intermediate and Novice singles and pairs Free Skating. Qualifying rounds only if an event is divided into groups. Juvenile, Intermediate and Novice Free Dance. Please reference www.usfigureskating.org for details on the program and points awarded.

ENTRY FEE: The entry fee must accompany the completed entry form and be received by no later than **Mar. 3, 2007**. Entries received after that date will be accepted only at the discretion of the referee and the competition committee, and will be subject to twice the normal fee. NO ENTRY FEE WILL BE REFUNDED AFTER THE CLOSE OF ENTRIES, March 3, 2007, unless no competition exists for that event.

NOTE: A \$25 fee will be charged if any check is returned due to insufficient funds. In addition, the skater will not be permitted to skate until the appropriate fees have been paid (CASH OR MONEY ORDER ONLY), including the \$25 returned check fee. There will be NO EXCEPTIONS!!

ONLINE APPLICATION SUBMITTAL AND PAYMENT: Please visit www.skatingclubofphoenix.com if you would like to submit your application and payment online. There will be an additional \$5.00 fee to cover the credit card charge to the club if you choose to pay online. The application deadline, March 3 at midnight, still applies. Applications may be submitted online beginning January 8, 2007.

ADMISSION: There is no admission charge to the any of the events.

REGISTRATION: A registration desk will be located at the entrance of the rink. Competitors must register upon arrival and check in at least 45 minutes before each event to be skated. Copies of results pages (25¢ each) and IJS skater event summaries will be available at the Registration desk.

MUSIC: Do not leave CDs or cassettes in the Arizona sun, especially on your dashboard, as damage may occur. Music will be played from cassette, CD or mini disc with only one (1) track, and must be plainly marked with name, event, and side to be played for the competition. Please do not use CD-RW CDs since there may be problems in playing them. Music must be rewound to the correct location and turned in at the music desk at least 1 hour prior to the event to be skated. After the event, music should be picked up at the registration desk. A back-up copy should be with you at the time of the competition in case of emergency. The music committee will not accept responsibility for any breakage, but will take every precaution to safeguard your music. We will not be responsible for any music not picked up after your practice or competition event.

AWARDS: Custom medals will be awarded to all 1st through 4th place skaters in all events.

JUNIOR BOARD AWARD - This award is given to the most outstanding performance at the Pre-Preliminary Free Skate level.

SKATING CLUB OF PHOENIX MEMORIAL TROPHY - This trophy will be awarded for the most artistic performance in the initial round of the Intermediate Free Skate portion of the competition.

PRACTICE ICE: Official practice ice sessions are scheduled for all competitors on Wednesday, April 18th. Each competitor may be assigned one unit of practice ice per event entered. Short and long programs are considered two events. Each unit will be 30 minutes long. The cost per unit is \$15.00. A draw will determine the order that music is played. Every attempt will be made to play each skater's music; however, there is no guarantee. Practice ice times will be posted online at www.SkatingClubofPhoenix.com.

Practice ice for those skaters arriving early is available through Desert Schools Coyotes Center Guest Services. If you wish to purchase ice for times other than the official practice session on Wednesday call 623-334-1200. Practice sessions during the competition will also be available through Desert Schools Coyotes Center on a first come first served basis.

TEST SESSION: A test session will be held early in the morning on Sunday, April 22, 2007. A test application is attached. Please postmark test forms by April 5th and send to Gloria Earnhardt-Hughes. **Do not send test forms to the Registrar.**

TRAVEL ARRANGEMENTS: Please do not make travel arrangements until the schedule has been announced. If the number of entrants exceeds the capacity of the competition, some entries may need to be refused. Refusals will be based on the **postmarked** date on the entry form envelope; those received earliest will be accepted first. Preference will *not* be given to skaters based on their geographical location or skating level. If the number of entrants is lower than expected, the competition could start on Friday, April 20, 2007. The tentative schedule will be posted online at www.SkatingClubofPhoenix.com, and the official bulletin board at the Peoria rink (located near the entrance to the North Pole).

OFFICIAL HOTELS: La Quinta Inn located at 16321 N 83rd Ave. Peoria, AZ 85382. This hotel features free high speed Internet and continental breakfast. It is less than ¼ mile from the rink. Rates are \$119.00 per night if you ask for the Fiesta Skate block of rooms. Reservations must be made no later than April 1st.

Comfort Suites located at 8473 W Paradise Lane Peoria, AZ 85382. This hotel is all studio suites with either two queen beds or one king. EVENTS - FREE SKATE

All free Skate program durations are +/- 10 secs. The Referee/Competition Committee may elect to combine Juvenile and Open Juvenile events if entries are limited.

EVENTS - ADULT FREE SKATE

Dependent upon the number of entries, divisions of Adult Free Skate events will be offered. The Competition Organizers reserve the right to combine events in the case of a single entry in any group. The combined group will free skate the items from the lower applicable group. Separate groups for men and women. *Minimum age: 21 years old. Note that +/- 10-second time allowances do not apply to Adult Events. Please note: some of the program requirements are listed incorrectly in the Rulebook. The section numbers to follow are correct.*

ADULT BRONZE FREE SKATE: Skater may not have passed higher than the Preliminary Free Skate Test or Adult Bronze Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with Rule 3791 in the 2006-07 rulebook. Program maximum time 1:40.

ADULT SILVER FREE SKATE: Skater must have passed at least the Preliminary Free Skate Test or Adult Bronze Free Skate Test, and no higher than Adult Silver Free Skate Test or Juvenile Free Skate. Program in accordance with Rule 3771 in the 2006-07 rulebook. Program maximum time 2:10.

ADULT GOLD FREE SKATE: Skater must have passed the Preliminary Free Skate Test or Adult Silver Free Skate Test, but no higher than the Standard Juvenile Free Skate Test. Program in accordance with Rule 3781 in the 2006-07 rulebook. Program maximum time 2:40.

ADULT MASTER FREE SKATE: Skaters must have passed the Pre-Juvenile or Adult Gold Free Skate test. Program in accordance with Rule 3741 in the 2006-07 Rulebook. Program max. time 3:40.

EVENTS - COMPULSORY PROGRAM

Compulsory Program is offered to No-Test through Juvenile/Open Juvenile levels only. The Compulsory Moves programs will be skated as a continuous program with all elements performed once in any order without music. The times listed for the individual categories below are maximum time limits; however, there is no minimum time requirement. If the maximum time is exceeded, no timing deduction will be taken; however, judging will stop. Elements are listed below for each category. **A mark for Required Elements (6.0 system first mark) will be the only mark awarded.** Additional, repeated or omitted elements will be penalized by a deduction of 0.2 points. Additional elements include jumps of ½ revolution or greater, and spins or spin-like movements of 1 revolution or greater. Where applicable, Moves-in-the-Field elements shall be skated in general accordance with the diagrams in Part 2 of the 2006-07 rulebook, but the exact number of repetitions of the element is not required.

NO-TEST COMPULSORY MOVES - Skater may not have passed any Freestyle test. Skaters must be a member of US Figure Skating as an individual member or as a club member. (no Basic Skills members). Will be skated on **half ice**. *Time limit: 1:15 minute.*

1. Consecutive Backward Outside Edges, minimum of 2 on each foot.
2. Flip.
3. Salchow.
4. Forward Outside Spiral, either foot.
5. One Foot Upright Spin, min. 3 revs.

PRE-PRELIMINARY COMPULSORY MOVES - Skaters shall not have passed the Preliminary MIF Test. Will be skated on **half ice**. *Time limit: 1:15 minute.*

1. Consecutive Backward Inside Edges, minimum of 4, TR 25.01(2); PPM Pattern 2
2. Waltz Eight, TR 25.01(4); PPM Pattern 4.
3. Single Toe Loop.
4. One Foot Upright Spin, minimum of 4 revolutions.

PRELIMINARY COMPULSORY MOVES - Skaters shall not have passed the Pre-Juvenile MIF Test. *Time limit: 1:15 minutes.*

1. Consecutive Outside and Inside Spirals, TR 25.02(2); PM Pattern 2.
2. Alternating Forward 3-Turns, TR 25.02(4); PM Pattern 4.
3. Loop Jump.
4. Sit Spin, minimum of 3 revolutions in position.

PRE-JUVENILE COMPULSORY MOVES - Skaters shall not have passed the Juvenile MIF Test. *Time limit: 1:30 minutes.*

1. Forward Outside-Back Inside 3-Turns in the Field, TR 25.03(3); PJM Patt. 3.
2. Five Step Mohawk Sequence, TR 25.03(6); PJM Pattern 6.
3. Single Lutz Jump.
4. Combination Spin with no change of foot and only one change of position. Any two positions allowed. Minimum of 3 revolutions in each position.

JUVENILE COMPULSORY MOVES - Skaters shall not have passed the Intermediate MIF Test. Skaters must be only 12 yrs of age by the close of entries. *Time limit: 1:30 min.*

1. Eight Step Mohawk Sequence, TR 25.04(1); JM Pattern 1.
2. Forward Double 3-Turns, TR 25.04(4); JM Pattern 4.
3. Jump Combination of any two single jumps.
4. Combination Spin with only one change of foot, minimum 4 revolutions each foot. Positions are free.

OPEN JUVENILE COMPULSORY MOVES - Same as Juvenile Compulsory Moves except skaters must have reached the age of 13 by the close of entries.

EVENTS - SHOWCASE (ARTISTIC)

Showcase events are open to all levels (No-Test through Senior, and Adult Pre-Bronze through Master). These events are designed to portray a character or theme through the use of music and costume. Vocal or instrumental music may be used. Costumes must be in good taste appropriate for family events. Only hand held props are permitted and may be placed on the ice. **ON-ICE PROPS ARE NOT ALLOWED (props which remain stationary throughout the performance).**

Skaters may enter both the Light Entertainment and Dramatic events if they choose. In the event that only one skater is entered in a Showcase event, events and/or levels may be combined to allow the event to be held (but not in the case of Pre-Preliminary being combined with Preliminary, to avoid confusion in qualifying for National Showcase). Male and female skaters may be combined in Showcase events, but will be separated when a sufficient number of entrants permits. Showcase Events will be judged using only the second mark in the 6.0 system:

COMPOSITION: Conformity of choreography with music and utilization of ice surface in a harmonious composition of the program as a whole. PRESENTATION: Style, originality and expression of the character of the music.

Showcase program durations (no minimum requirement):

All restrictions that apply to the free Skate events with respect to allowable jumps and spins apply to the same level of the Showcase events. There are no required elements for Showcase events at any level. Somersault jumps where the skater actually leaves the ice and flips in the air are **not** permitted. Acrobatic moves such as somersaults on the ice, cartwheels, and other similar moves **are** permitted.

EVENTS - PAIRS FREE SKATE

Age requirements are as of close of entries.

Preliminary Pairs - Free Skate duration 1:30 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Eligibility: Neither partner needs to have passed any Pair Test, but may not have passed the Juvenile Pair Test. Will be conducted in accordance with Rule 4100 of the 2006-07 rulebook.

Pre-Juvenile Pairs - Free Skate duration 2:00 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Refer to Rule 4090 for eligibility and program requirements.

Juvenile Pairs - Free Skate duration 2:30 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Eligibility: must be less than 16 years of age at close of entries. Note: age requirement in the Rulebook is incorrect. Refer to Rule 4080 of the 2006-07 rulebook for test qualifications and program requirements.

Intermediate Pairs - Free Skate duration 3:00 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Refer to Rule 4070 of the 2006-07 rulebook for eligibility and program requirements.

Novice Pairs - Short Program duration maximum 2:30 minutes. Free Skate duration 3:30 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Refer to Rule 4060 of the 2006-07 rulebook for eligibility and program requirements.

Junior Pairs - Short Program duration maximum 2:50 minutes. Free Skate duration 4:00 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Refer to Rule 4050 of the 2006-07 rulebook for eligibility and program requirements.

Senior Pairs - Short Program duration maximum 2:50 minutes. Free Skate duration 4:30 minutes, +/- 10 seconds. Refer to Rule 4040 of the 2006-07 rulebook for eligibility and program requirements.

EVENTS - ICE DANCE

The events will be conducted according to 2006-07 Rulebook Rules 4200 through 4492. Free Dance events will be conducted in accordance with Rule 4270. There are no age restrictions. Dances and rhythms skated will be for the 2006-07 competitive season.
