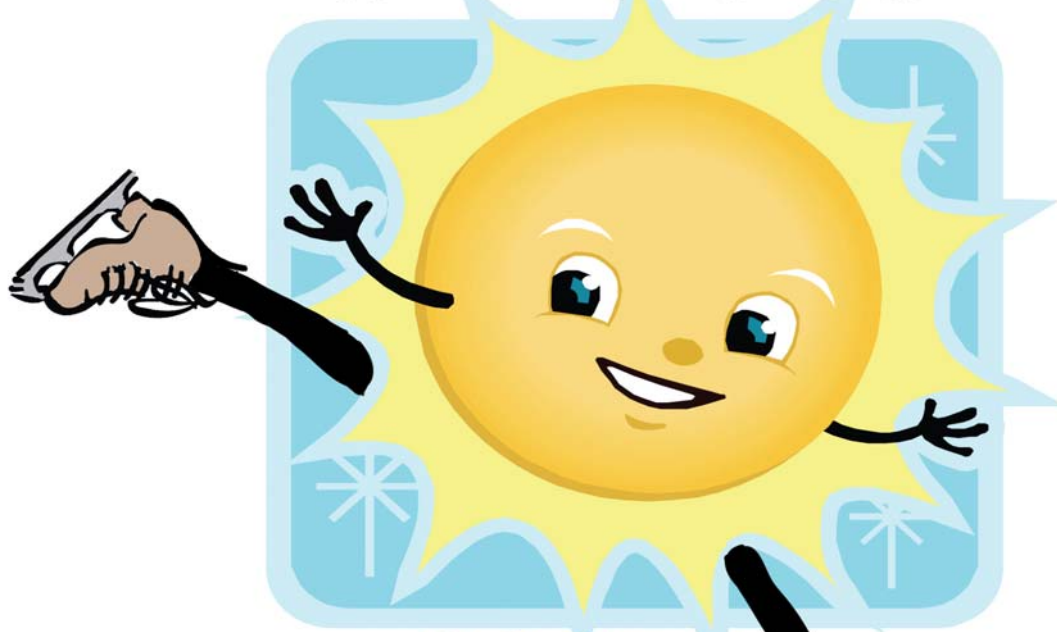

GENERAL INFORMATION

Facility

The ice surface is indoors, 85' X 200', with slightly rounded corners. It is located at the Toyota Ice Arena (formerly known as Three Rivers Ice Arena), 7100 W. Quinault, Ave., Kennewick, WA 99336.

Entries

Complete and mail with entry fee to **Registrar, Lori Gibson, 801 S. Buntin St, Kennewick, WA 99336** Enclose a self-addressed, stamped legal sized envelope to receive a copy of the competition and practice ice schedule. **Entries must be filled out completely and be postmarked by July 6, 2007.** Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the referee and the local organizing committee and will be subject to a \$20 late entry fee. **No entries will be accepted after the draw has been completed.**

Eligibility for entries is governed by tests passed and age as of deadline for entry, July 6, 2007. Adult competitors must be age 21 or over. All skaters should be prepared to show proof of age. **Any skater may enter one event higher than the event for which he/she qualifies by test.**

Refunds will be issued in accordance with Rule 3230 of the US Figure Skating Rulebook and only if the event is not held. In any event with only one entry, the skater will be offered the option of withdrawing from the event (with a refund), skating an exhibition or critique if time permits (without a refund). All refunds, if applicable, will be mailed within 30 days after the completion of the competition.

ISU Judging System (IJS)

All short program and free skating Singles events at the Juvenile through Senior levels will be judged in accordance with the ISU Judging System (Rules 3430 through 3435). All other events, including Open Juvenile freeskate, will be judged in accordance with the 6.0 Judging System (Rules 3400 through 3428) and as otherwise specified in this announcement. **All Skaters in the Juvenile freeskate and Intermediate through Senior short program and freeskate Singles events are required to submit the *PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT FORM* with their entry form.** A \$25 processing fee will be charged for any entry missing this form.

Registration

The official registration desk will be located at the Toyota Ice Arena, beginning Thursday, August 16th. All competitors are required to register as soon as possible after arrival at the rink. Competition CDs should be turned in at this time.

Official Notices

An official bulletin board will be maintained at the competition site. The official schedule showing starting times for each event and the draw will be posted on the bulletin board. The official schedule supersedes all other schedules. Notices posted on this bulletin board are considered as sufficient notice to all competitors. Skaters are to be in the rink and ready to skate 60 minutes before their event is scheduled to begin. Events will not be delayed for skaters who arrive late. Decisions by the Referee in all matters will be final.

Music

Music shall be reproduced by CDs only (no CD/RWs or DVD). We will not accept cassette tapes. CD's must contain only one cut of music. Clearly label CD with the skater's name, his/her professional's name, the event, and the music run time. Do not place any type of small attachable labels on the CD. CD must be turned in at the time of official registration. All competitors must have an extra copy (CD) available at rinkside. Once the CD is turned in, it will not be returned until the event is completed. Tri-Cities Figure Skating Club will not accept responsibility for breakage, damage, or loss, but will take every precaution to safeguard music media.

Admission

No admission will be charged. All events are open to spectators.

Awards

Awards will be presented at the photographer's table immediately after the official posting of each event. Awards will be given for first through fourth places in Non-Test through Senior and first through fifth places in Basic Skills.

Practice Ice

Reservations for ALL practice ice must be made and paid in advance. Practice sessions will be held each day of the competition. Practice ice will be \$12 per 30-minute session. **Requests for practice ice** should be mailed as **a part of your registration form**. Sign up for **one practice session per event entered**. No music will be played during practice sessions. Extra sessions may become available after the schedule is determined. These openings will be sold on a first-come, first-serve basis at a cost of \$15 per 30-minute session. Contact the practice ice monitor during practice sessions to request additional time. **Practice ice schedules will be mailed with the competition schedule if a stamped, self-addressed, legal-size envelope is included**. Information will not be available by phone! There will be no refunds for those who do not appear for their reserved practice session.

Videotaping

Videotaping is permissible only in upper viewing area. No video taping from rink side. Please be courteous to those viewing the event. **NO FLASH PHOTOGRAPHY IS PERMITTED**. Videotapes will be available to purchase.

Non-Qualifying Competition

This competition is open to qualified skaters who are registered members of the U.S. Figure Skating. This is a non-qualifying competition and will be governed by the current U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook except as modified by this announcement and corrections provided at <http://www.usfigureskating.org/content/2006-2007%20Rulebook%20Errata.pdf>. Competitors will skate under current rules as may be modified by the outcome of the 2007 U.S. Figure Skating Governing Council meeting. All competitors shall be responsible for becoming informed and conforming to such rule changes coming out of the 2007 U.S. Figure Skating Governing Council meeting.

The Referee and LOC reserves the right to combine Ladies and Men's events where permitted by the current U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook. Any singles skater may enter one event level higher than the event for which he/she qualifies based on the skater's current U.S. Figure Skating test level. Skaters must skate U.S. Figure Skating elements for the Short Program as written for the 2007-2008 season in the current U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook. For pairs, test level is governed by the partner with the higher test.

Events with large numbers of entries may be split into multiple, equal-sized groups at the discretion of the Referee and LOC. In such cases, events will be split by age for Non-Test through Open Juvenile and Adults, by draw for Juvenile through Senior. No final rounds will be skated for Non-Test through Open Juvenile and Adults.

In the Intermediate through Senior Singles and Pairs categories, the short and freeski programs will be scored as combined events, meaning that skaters in these events are required to enter both short program and freeskiing program.

Fees

The entry fee is \$75 for the one event (Non-Test – Open Juvenile) and \$85.00 for the one event (Juvenile), \$100 for two events (Intermediate – Senior), and \$25 for each additional event entered. The entry fee for Pairs is \$100 per team for FS events Preliminary – Intermediate and \$150 per team for Short/Freeski events Novice -Senior.

A fee of \$25 will be charged for checks returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF) and must be paid prior to the start of competition in order to compete.

Event Qualifications & Specifications

Compulsory Moves: Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. Compulsory moves will be skated without music in a program format. Required moves may be done in any order, without stops between elements. Each additional or repeated element will be penalized by .2. Connecting footwork is allowed but may not include half jumps. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. Skaters will receive one mark overall from each judge for Technical Merit. Events will be skated on a half-sheet of ice. Ladies and men may compete with each other at the discretion of the Referee.

Jump Event: Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. No music will be played. Jumps may be skated twice and in any order. The best of the two jump attempts for each required jump and combination will be judged. If a skater is satisfied with the 1st jump attempt, then the 2nd attempt is not required. In situations where the skater is given the choice of the jumps to be performed, the first attempt will determine the jump to be judged; the skater will not be allowed to change jumps on the second attempt. Event will be skated on one half (1/2) of the ice surface for Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile and full ice surface for Juvenile/Open-Juvenile through Intermediate. The judges will award one mark overall to each skater for technical merit. Ladies and men may compete with each other at the discretion of the Referee.

Spins Event: Age and test requirements are the same as Free Skate. No music will be played. Spins must be skated exactly as stated but may be skated in any order. Connecting steps may be used but will not affect the score. Event will be skated on one half (1/2) of the ice surface. The judges will award one mark overall to each skater for technical merit. Ladies and men may compete with each other at the discretion of the Referee.

Showcase: Ladies and men will compete against one another in the Showcase event. Showcase events of different levels may be combined at the discretion of the Referee. Each judge will award one mark to each skater for presentation. Only two (2) double jumps are permitted for Intermediate – Senior, but not encouraged. Only single jumps, including axels, will be allowed for Pre-Preliminary – Juvenile/Open Juvenile. A .2 deduction per violation will be taken for programs violating this restriction. Props which are placed on the ice will not be permitted except for Basic Skills levels. The music may be vocal and/or instrumental. **Showcase** is intended as an event to develop and enhance the qualities of original choreography, general showmanship, and entertainment value. There will not be separate events for Light Entertainment and Dramatic Showcases.

Time Duration: Basic Skills Snowplow Sam – Basic D = 1:00 +/- 10 seconds

Basic Free Skate 1-6 = 1:30 +/- 10 seconds

Non-Test – Pre-Juvenile = 1:40 maximum;

Juvenile/Open Juvenile – Novice = 2:10 maximum

Junior – Senior = 2:40 maximum

Artistic Award: An artistic skate off will take place to determine the skaters who will receive the Artistic Award. An Artistic Award will be presented to two skaters; one lower division (Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile/Open Juvenile) and one upper division (Intermediate through Senior). The award will be judged on outstanding artistry, the manner and style of the skater, and choreography. **Skaters will be nominated, by the panel of officials for the freeskating events, to skate in the artistic skateoff based on their artistic performance during the freeskating events. The selected skaters for the skate off will be notified at the end of Freeskating events and a final round will take place at the end of the competition. In the skateoff final events, each skater will receive one mark from each judge for program components.**

EVENT SPECIFICS

Non-test (Beginner)— Open to skaters who have not passed any free skating test. May have passed Free Skate tests (1-6) in Basic Skills and the Pre-Preliminary MIF test but not have passed Pre-Preliminary FS.

Freeskate: All single jumps. No axel or double jumps allowed. A 0.2 deduction per violation will be taken for each non-allowed element performed. See Rule 3721 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 1:00 to 1:30.

Compulsory Moves: ½ ice, 1 minute maximum, No Music

1. Waltz jump
2. Single loop jump
3. Upright spin with free leg position towards knee level
4. Forward spiral

Jumps Event: ½ Ice, 1 minute maximum.

1. Waltz Jump
2. Toe Loop
3. Loop Jump

Spin Event: ½ Ice, 1 minute maximum.

1. Camel spin
2. Sit spin (min. 3 revolutions)
3. One foot forward upright spin (free foot position optional)

Showcase Event: Time 1:40 maximum

Pre-Preliminary — Open to skaters who have not passed the Preliminary FS Test.

Freeskate: All single jumps. Axel allowed, no doubles. See Rule 3711 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 1:30.

Compulsory Moves— ½ Ice, 1:20 minute maximum, No Music

1. Single loop jump
2. Jump combination of any two single jumps, no single axel
3. Sit spin (min 3 revolutions)
4. A forward spiral

Jumps Event: ½ Ice, 1 minute maximum.

1. Single loop
2. Combination of any two single jumps. (no change of foot or turn in between)

Spin Event: ½ Ice, 1 minute maximum.

1. One foot forward upright spin (free foot position optional)
2. One foot upright back spin
3. Sit spin (min. 3 revolutions)

Showcase Event: Time 1:40 maximum

Preliminary — Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-preliminary FS Test, but no higher than the Preliminary FS Test.

Freeskate: Axel allowed and up to 2 different doubles which can be repeated in combination with a maximum of 3 combinations. See Rule 3701 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 1:30.

Compulsory Moves: ½ Ice, 1:20 minute maximum, No music.

1. Single flip jump
2. Jump combination of any single jump plus a single loop jump
3. Sit spin (minimum 3 revolutions).
4. Upright back spin
5. Step sequence

Jumps Event: ½ Ice, 1 minute maximum.

1. Salchow.
2. Flip.
3. Combination of any two single jumps

Spin Event: ½ Ice, 1 minute maximum.

1. Sit spin (min. 3 revolutions/in position).
2. Camel spin (min. 3 revolutions/in position)
3. Forward Scratch spin.

Showcase Event: Time 1:40 maximum

Pre-Juvenile — Open to skaters who have passed the Preliminary FS Test, but no higher than the Pre-Juvenile FS Test.

Freeskate: Axel allowed and up to 4 different doubles which can be repeated in combination with a max. of 3 combinations. See Rule 3691 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 2:00.

Compulsory Moves: ½ Ice, 1:20 minutes maximum, No music.

1. Single lutz jump.
2. Jump Combination of any two single jumps
3. Front scratch to back scratch pin
4. Camel spin
5. Step sequence

Jumps Event: ½ Ice, 1:10 maximum.

1. Axel
2. Double Salchow
3. Jump Combo with single Loop as second jump. First jump skater's choice. No change of foot or turn in between jumps.

Spins Event: ½ Ice, 1:20 minute maximum.

1. Camel spin (min. 4 revolutions/spin).
2. Forward scratch to backward scratch (min. 4 revolutions/spin).
3. Combination spin – camel to sit (min. 4 revolutions/spin) (no change of foot).

Showcase Event: Time 1:40 maximum

Juvenile/Open Juvenile — Open to skaters who have passed the Pre-juvenile FS Test, but no higher than the Juvenile FS Test. Participants in the Free Skate event will be split by age 13 and over - Open Juvenile; 12 year and under - Juvenile.

Freeskate: See Rule 3681 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 2:15

Compulsory Moves: ½ ice, Max. 1:20 minutes maximum, No music.

1. Single axel.
2. Jump combination of a double/single, single/double, or two single jumps, no single axel
3. Camel spin
4. Sit change sit spin
5. Circular step sequence

Jumps Event: Full Ice, 1:10 maximum

1. Axel.
2. Jump combination with a double and a single jump or two double jumps. No change of foot or turn in between jumps.
3. Double loop

Spins Event: ½ Ice, 1:20 minute maximum.

1. A flying spin (min. 4 revolutions/in position).
2. Ladies: layback or attitude spin. Men: camel spin (min. 4 revolutions/in position).
3. Spin with one change of foot, change of position optional (min. 4 revolutions per foot).

Showcase Event: Time 2:10 maximum

Intermediate — Open to skaters who have passed the Juvenile FS test, but no higher than the Intermediate FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3672 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: 2:30.

Short Program: Program time: 2:00 max.

Jumps Event: Full Ice, 1:10 maximum.

1. Axel.
2. Double Loop or double Flip.
3. One jump combo consisting of either one single and one double jump, or two double jumps.

Spins Event: ½ Ice, 1:20 minute maximum.

1. Sit spin to change foot sit spin (min. 4 revolutions each foot).
2. Flying camel (min. 5 revolutions).
3. Spin combo with one change of foot and one change of position (min. 4 revolutions each foot).

Showcase Event: Time 2:10 maximum

Novice — Open to skaters who have passed the Intermediate FS test, but no higher than the Novice FS Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3663 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: Ladies 3:00, Men 3:30.

Short program: Program time: 2:30 maximum.

Showcase Event: Time 2:10 maximum

Junior— Open to skaters who have passed the Novice FS test, but no higher than the Junior FS test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3653 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: Ladies 3:30, Men 4:00

Short Program: Skaters must skate U.S. Figure Skating elements for the short program as written for the 2007-2008 season in the current rulebook, and as corrected on the US Figure Skating website. Note that for Junior Men, the flying spin shall be a sit spin, and the spin with change of foot shall be a camel spin with change of foot, and that for Junior Ladies, the flying spin shall be a sit spin. Program time: 2:50 maximum

Showcase Event: Time 2:40 maximum

Senior— Open to skaters who have passed the Junior FS test, but no higher than Senior FS test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3643 for well-balanced program requirements. Time: Ladies 4:00, Men 4:30.

Short program: Program time: 2:50 maximum

Showcase Event: Time 2:40 maximum

Adult: See Rules 3730-3806 for Test Requirements.

Adults Pre-Bronze— Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no U.S. Figure Skating test and or no higher than the Adult Pre-Bronze skating test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary free skating test or the ISI Freestyle 3 test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3806 for well balanced program requirements. Program time: 1:40 maximum.

Adult Bronze— Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no higher than the Adult Bronze Free Skating Test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating Test or the ISI Freestyle 4 Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3801 for well balanced program requirements. Program time: 1:40 maximum.

Adult Silver— Open to skaters who have reached the age of 21 and have passed no higher than the Adult Silver Free Skating Test, the standard U.S. Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating Test or the ISI Freestyle 5 Test.

Freeskate: See Rule 3791 for well balanced program requirements. Program time: 2:10 maximum.

Basic Skills Competition

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete **but must be registered with the host Basic Skills program/club or any other Basic Skills program/club.**

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All **SNOWPLOW SAM** and **BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8** must skate at highest level passed and **NO** official U.S. Figure Skating Tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dance.

Skaters in **FREE SKATE 1-6** may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition and may have passed pre-preliminary moves in the field. For events that are "Beyond the Basics" (beginner, pre-preliminary and preliminary) the U.S. Figure Skating Rule 1032 applies.

Please note: If a skater competes at a non-qualifying competition in a "Beginner or No Test" category, then that skater must compete at the equivalent or higher level in a Basic Skills approved competition.

Fees

The entry fee is \$45 for the first event and \$15 for each additional event entered. If not currently a member of U.S. Figure Skating or Basic Skills an additional \$5.00 membership fee must be included and membership form submitted with entry. **A charge of \$25 will be assessed for checks returned for non-sufficient funds (NSF) and must be paid in full prior to the start of competition in order to compete.**

To withdraw, notify THE REGISTRAR immediately. **NO Refunds for any reason after the** closing date unless the event is canceled by the LOC.

Boys and girls may be combined to compete in the same event, at the discretion of the Referee and LOC. Events with large numbers of entries may be split into multiple, equal-sized groups by age (with no more than 3 years age difference total in a group) at the discretion of the Referee and LOC. No final rounds will be skated.

Awards

Awards will be presented at the photographer's table immediately after the official posting of each event. Awards will be given for first through fifth places in all Basic Skills events.

Event Qualifications & Specifications

Requirements at the Basic Skills Program Levels 1-8

- The skating order of the required elements is optional.
- The elements are not restricted as to number of times element is executed, or length of glides, number of revolutions in a spin etc., unless otherwise stated
- Minimum number of connecting steps are allowed

Snowplow Sam - TOTS:

1. March followed by a two foot glide and dip
2. Forward two foot swizzles 2-3-in a row
3. Backward wiggles 2-6 in a row
4. Forward snowplow stop

Basic 1:

1. Forward two foot glide
2. Forward two foot swizzles - 6 -8 in a row
3. Backward wiggles 6-8 in a row
4. Forward snowplow stop

Basic 2:

1. Forward one foot glide - either foot
2. Two foot turn in place - forward to backward
3. Backward two foot swizzles - 6 - 8 in a row
4. Forward alternating ½ swizzle pumps, in a straight line -across width of ice
5. Moving snowplow stop

Basic 3 :

1. Forward stroking
2. Forward ½ swizzle pumps on a circle, either clockwise or counter clockwise 6 -8 consecutive
3. Moving forward to backward two foot turn - either direction
4. Backward one foot glide - either foot
5. Two foot spin

Basic 4:

1. Forward outside edge on a circle clockwise or counter clockwise
2. Forward crossovers 6-8 consecutive both directions
3. Forward outside 3-turn - R and L
4. Backward stroking
5. Backward snowplow stop - R or L

Requirements at the Basic Skills Program Levels Free Skate 1-6

- Groups will be divided by age.
- Program Duration 1:30 +/- 10 sec
- Vocal music is not permitted in Free Skate Programs

Free Skate 1 The required elements are:

1. Advanced forward stroking (4-6 consecutive strokes)
2. Basic forward outside edges or forward inside consecutive edges - 2-4 outside or 2-4 inside edges
3. Scratch spin from backward crossovers
4. Waltz jump from backward crossovers
5. Half flip jump

- May use vocal music.
- May use elements from a previous level. Deductions will be made if elements from a higher level are skated.
- Time 1:00 +/- 10 sec., to be skated on full ice
- Each judge will award one mark for Technical Merit to each skater

Basic 5:

1. Backward outside edge on a circle - clockwise or counterclockwise
2. Backward crossovers 6-8 consecutive - both directions
3. One foot spin - min of three revolutions
4. Side Toe hop -either direction
5. Hockey stop

Basic 6:

1. Forward inside 3-turn - R & L
2. Bunny Hop
3. Forward arabesque spiral on a straight line R or L
4. Lunge - R or L
5. T-stop - R or L

Basic 7:

1. Forward inside open Mohawk - R to L and L to R
2. Ballet Jump either direction
3. Back crossovers to a back outside edge landing position - clockwise and counter clockwise
4. Forward inside pivot

Basic 8:

1. Moving forward outside or forward inside 3 turns R and L
2. Waltz jump
3. Mazurka - either direction
4. Combination move - clockwise or counter clockwise – (2 forward crossovers into FI Mohawk, step behind, step into 1 back crossover and step to a forward inside edge)
5. Beginning one-foot upright spin, optional free foot position

Free Skate 2 The required elements are:

1. Forward outside spiral - R or L
2. Waltz Three's - R or L
3. Beginning back spin
4. Waltz jump, side toe hop, waltz jump series
5. Toe loop jump

Free Skate 3 The required elements are:

1. Forward crossovers in a figure 8
2. Advanced forward outside swing rolls - 4-6 consecutive
3. Back spin
4. Salchow
5. Waltz jump/toe loop or Salchow/toe loop

Free Skate 5 The required elements are:

1. Spiral Sequence: FO Spiral, forward outside 3 turn, one backward crossover, backward inside spiral
2. Camel spin
3. Forward upright spin to back upright spin
4. Loop/loop combination jump
5. Flip jump

Free Skate 4 The required elements are:

1. Spiral sequence: FI spiral, FI Mohawk, BO spiral, clockwise or counter clockwise
2. Forward power 3's, 2-3 consecutive sets,- R or L
3. Sit spin
4. Loop jump
5. Waltz jump/loop jump

Free Skate 6 The required elements are:

1. Five step Mohawk sequence - 1 set alternating pattern (refer to Basic Skills curriculum Free Skate level 6)
2. Camel, sit spin combination - minimum of 4 revolutions total
3. Split jump or stag jump
4. Waltz jump, 1/2 loop, salchow combination
5. Lutz jump

BASIC SKILLS ARTISTIC/SHOWCASE EVENTS

Skaters must skate in the same level as Free Skate event.

Use elements from the Basic Skills Artistry in Motion curriculum. (Duration: 1:30 or less)

Theme of skater's choice. Skaters will be divided into age and into five levels:

Snowplow Sam

Basic 1 & 2

Basic 3 & 4

Basic 5 & 6

Basic 7 & 8

- **Music may have vocals.**
- Judging to emphasize interpretation of music rather than technical skills
- Costumes that complement music
- Each judge will award one mark for presentation for each skater.

Hand held props or stationary props may be used if skater can get them on and off ice without assistance within 1 minute time duration.
