The Portland Summer Open will be conducted according to the rules set forth by the current US Figure Skating Rulebook except as otherwise stated by this announcement. Rink Information: Indoor ice surface, 85'x200', with slightly rounded corners. The main skating area is unheated with a seating area along one side of the rink surface. Warm clothing is advised.

Eligibility: The competition is open to all registered eligible skaters of US Figure Skating. Eligibility for entry is governed as of tests passed on or before May 25, 2007 and age as of May 25, 2007. Adult skaters must be age 21 or older. Skaters should be prepared to provide proof of age if asked. Eligibility for pairs and dance events are governed by the competitor with the highest test passed.

UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED IN THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, COMPETITORS MAY ENTER ONE CLASS HIGHER THAN THEIR TEST LEVEL AS OF MAY 25, 2007.

Judging System: We are planning on utilizing the "Mini System", the computerized International Judging System (IJS) scoring for Intermediate through Senior Short Program and Juvenile/Open Juvenile through Senior Free Skate. The 6.0 system will be utilized for all other Events. Skaters entering IJS events are required to submit a planned program content sheet for **each** event entered. The LOC reserves the right to use the 6.0 system for some events if IJS-qualified officials are unavailable.

Updates to Announcement: Check **PISC.ORG** for any update or addendums to the announcement.

Entries: Entries must be postmarked on or before May 25, 2007. Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Chief Referee. If accepted, a late fee of \$20.00 will be charged.

Refunds: After the entry deadline, refunds will be given only if an event is cancelled/not scheduled. This US Figure Skating rule 3235 shall be strictly enforced. Refunds will be given for withdrawing prior to entry deadline.

Registration: The official registration desk will be located in the lobby of Mountain View Ice Arena and will open beginning one hour before the first event. All competitors are required to check in at the registration desk at least one (1) hour prior to their first scheduled event. Skaters must be prepared to take the ice 45 minutes prior to their scheduled events.

- Changes to Event Entries:** Changes or additions to event entries after skating orders are posted will be permitted at the discretion of the Chief Accountant and Chief Referee.
- Previous Winners:** First place winners in all freestyle events from Spring Festival 2006 must move up at least one level regardless of their test level, with the exception of Junior and Senior skaters.
- Event Group/Size:** There may be more than one group per event. Events may be divided into multiple equal size groups by age for Non-Test through Pre-Juvenile and by draw for Juvenile through Senior and Adult. Final rounds will be skated for the Juvenile through Senior if there is more than one group. Your group may include both girls and boys, however you will be advised if this occurs. **IF THERE IS ONLY ONE ENTRANT AT A LEVEL, EVERY EFFORT WILL BE MADE TO MERGE LEVELS. IF THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE THE FEE WILL BE REFUNDED.**
- Music:** All competitors except for compulsory dance competitors must provide their own music on CDs or cassettes. The CD or cassette must be clearly marked with the skater's name, event, and side to be played. Music must start at the beginning of the tape or CD with no more than a 10 second leader. Cassette tapes need to be rewound. Each CD or cassette must have only music for one program on it. For CDs, please only provide music burned on CD/Rs, some older CD players will not play music burned on CD/RWs. Please have an extra copy of the music available, in case of a problem with the music. It is the responsibility of the competitor to have a back up copy close to the ice during the event should the need arise. PISC will not accept responsibility for breakage, loss or damage, but will take every reasonable precaution to protect each cassette/CD.
- Music must be turned in one (1) hour prior to the event to be skated.**
- Official Notes:** A bulletin board displaying official information will be located in the arena lobby. Posting on this board will be considered sufficient notice to all competitors.
- General Awards:** Each group will receive awards immediately after completion of the event. Awards will be given to first through fourth place.
All events will be photographed regardless of photo purchase.
- Special Awards:** The **Portland Summer Open Artistic Achievement Award** will be awarded to one lower division (Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile) and one upper division (Juvenile through Senior) skater based on the following: Outstanding artistic qualities, choreography that blends well with music, variety and creativity, good use of the ice surface, and manner and style of the skater. Preliminary round skaters will be notified at the end of Saturday's event with the final round skated on Sunday.
- The **Lauren Bernstein Memorial Spirit Award** will be given to the skater competing in the Juvenile through Novice level who best exemplifies the spirit and the heart of the skating experience.
- The **Lauren Zell Award** will be given to a skater selected from all entrants in recognition of the accomplishment represented by skating at their current level.
- NEW "Spirit of Competition" Award** will be awarded to all skaters that participate in **all** three Portland Metro-area competitions (Spalding Ice Classic, Portland Summer Open, 2nd Annual Sherwood Invitational) in the Non-Test through Senior level Free Skate events. This award will also be awarded to those skaters participating in Basic Skills Free Skate events at both Spalding Ice Classic and 2nd Annual Sherwood Invitational. These awards will be presented at the 2nd Annual Sherwood Invitational.

- Practice Ice:** Official practice ice will be available at the Mountain View Ice Arena as time permits throughout the competition. Other ice time may be available at the Lloyd Center Ice Area, Sherwood Ice Arena and Valley Ice Arena. Each thirty (30) minute practice session will cost \$10.00. Practice ice will be assigned in the order of receipt of reservations. See the Practice Ice Request Form for specifics.
- Internet:** This announcement information will also be on the Internet. A schedule of events will be placed on the website, approximately one week prior to the event.
- Warm Up Music:** Music may be played during warm up for all events except Compulsory Moves.
- Photograph and Video:** A photographer will be present to photograph all award events. The competition events will be video taped and available. The vendors will make a separate charge for these services. For details, see the vendors upon arrival at the rink. **All events will be photographed and video taped regardless of purchase.**

EVENTS

FREE SKATE EVENTS

Short program elements shall be as specified for the 2007-2008 season. Juvenile through Senior **must** submit planned program content forms with their competition entry.

- Non-test Low:** Must not have passed any US Figure Skating Free Skating tests and be age 17 or under. All half jumps (Waltz, half loop, half flip, half lutz, half toe walley and any other jumps considered to be half rotation) are permitted and may be repeated alone or in combination. No single jumps, Axels, multi-revolution jumps, jumped or flying spins are allowed. Deductions will be made for jumps and spins that are not allowed. **Duration 1:30**
- Non-test High:** Must not have passed any US Figure Skating Free Skating tests and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted and may be repeated. No combination jumps, Axels, multi-revolution jumps, jumped or flying spins are allowed. Deductions will be made for jumps and spins that are not allowed. **Duration 1:30**
- Pre-Preliminary-No Axel:** Must not have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating test and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted, excluding Axel, and may be repeated alone or in combination. No multi-revolution jumps, jumped or flying spins are allowed. Deductions will be made for jumps and spins that are not allowed. **Duration 1:30**
- Pre-Preliminary-Axel:** Must not have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating test and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted, including Axel, and may be repeated alone or in combination. No multi-revolution jumps, jumped or flying spins are allowed. Deductions will be made for jumps and spins that are not allowed. **Duration 1:30**
- Preliminary:** Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Pre-Preliminary Free Skating test but not the US Figure Skating Pre-Juvenile Free Skating test and be age 17 or under. All single jumps are permitted, including Axel, and any 2 double jumps may be repeated alone or in combination. Deductions will be made for jumps that are not allowed. **Duration 1:30**
- Pre-Juvenile:** Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Preliminary Free Skating test but not the US Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating test. All single jumps are permitted, including Axel, and any 4 double jumps may be repeated alone or in combination. Deductions will be made for jumps that are not allowed. **Duration 2:00**
- Juvenile:** Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Free Skating Pre-Juvenile test but not the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating test and be 12 years of age or under. **Duration 2:15**
- Open Juvenile:** Same rules as for Juvenile Free Skate with the exception of being age 13 or over.
- Intermediate:** Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Juvenile Free Skating test but not the US Figure Skating Novice Free Skating test. **Short program duration 2:00 MAX** with required elements as stated in accordance with current US Figure Skating rules for the 2007-2008 Season. **Long program duration 2:30**
(Skaters may enter either short or long or both).
- Novice:** Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Junior Free Skating Test. **Short program duration 2:30 MAX** with required Elements as stated in accordance with current US Figure Skating rules for the 2007-2008 Season. **Long program duration 3:00 (ladies) 3:30 (men)** (Skaters may enter either short or long or both).

Free skate (continued)

Junior: Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Novice Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Senior Free Skating Test. **Short program duration 2:50 MAX** with required elements as stated in accordance with current US Figure Skating rules for the 2007-2008 Season. See clarification below. **Long program duration 3:30 (ladies) and 4:00 (men)**
(Skaters may enter either short or long or both events).

Junior Men's Short Program

A discrepancy in the required elements for the junior men's short program has been brought to the attention of the chair of the Singles Committee. This discrepancy needs to be clarified. For the 2007-08 skating season, the 2006 ISU Rulebook (pp. 87, Group C) states that d) a flying sit spin and e) a camel spin with only one change of foot are required in the junior men's short program. The 2007 edition of the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook (pp. 565, Group C) states that a d) flying camel spin and e) sit spin with only one change of foot are required in the junior men's short programs.

At the junior and senior levels, it is U.S. Figure Skating policy to follow the ISU regulations concerning questions of this nature. Therefore, the flying SIT spin and CAMEL spin with only one change of foot will be required in the junior men's short program for the 2007-08 season (Group C).

Junior Ladies Short Program

A discrepancy in the required elements for the junior ladies short program has been brought to the attention of the chair of the Singles Committee. This discrepancy needs to be clarified. For the 2007-08 skating season, the 2006 ISU Rulebook (pp. 87, Group C) states that d) a flying sit spin is required in the junior ladies short program. The 2007 edition of the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook (pp. 567, Group C) states that a d) flying camel spin is required in the junior ladies short programs.

At the junior and senior levels, it is U.S. Figure Skating policy to follow the ISU regulations concerning questions of this nature. Therefore, the flying SIT spin will be required in the junior ladies short program for the 2007-08 season (Group C).

These clarifications will be reflected on the online charts when they are updated. The 2008 edition of the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook will also reflect this correction.

Senior: Shall have passed the US Figure Skating Junior Free Skating Test. **Short program duration 2:50 MAX** with required elements as stated in accordance with current US Figure Skating rules for the 2007-2008 Season. **Long program duration 4:00 (ladies) 4:30 (men)**
(Skaters may enter either short or long or both events).

Adult Non-Test: Shall be 21 years or older and shall not have passed any US Figure Skating tests. Only Half jumps, Salchow, and Toe-Loop jumps are allowed. **Duration: 1:30 MAX.**

Adult Pre-Bronze: Shall be 21 years or older and shall not have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Bronze or Preliminary Free Skating Test. All single jumps except Lutz and Axel are allowed. **Duration: 1:40 MAX**

Adult Bronze: Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Pre-Bronze or Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Adult Silver or Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test. No axels and no double jumps are allowed. **Duration: 1:40 MAX**

Adult Silver: Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Bronze or Pre-Preliminary Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Adult Gold or Juvenile Free Skating Test. Axels are permitted, but no double jumps are allowed. **Duration: 2:10 MAX**

Adult Gold: Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Silver or Pre-Juvenile Free Skating Test but not the US Figure Skating Intermediate Free Skating Test. **Duration: 2:40 MAX**

Free skate (continued)

Adult Master: Shall be 21 years or older and shall have passed the US Figure Skating Adult Gold Free Skating Test or the US Figure Skating Juvenile (or higher) Free Skating Test. **Duration: 3:40 MAX**

PAIR EVENTS

Short program elements shall be as specified for the 2007-2008 season. Short program time is maximum allowed, free skate time is +/-10 seconds.

Statement of Clarification

A discrepancy in the required elements in the junior and senior pairs short programs has been brought to the attention of the chair of the Pairs Committee.

This discrepancy needs to be clarified. For the 2007-08 skating season, the 2006 ISU Rulebook (pp. 92-93, Group B, h) states that a step sequence (straight line, circular, serpentine) is required in the both the junior and senior pairs short programs. The 2007 edition of the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook (pp. 587, 594, Group B, h) states that a spiral step sequence is required in both short programs.

At the junior and senior level, it is U.S. Figure Skating policy to follow the ISU regulations concerning questions of this nature. Therefore, the STEP SEQUENCE (STRAIGHT LINE, CIRCULAR, SERPENTINE) will be required in the junior and senior pairs short program for the 2007-08 season (Group B). This clarification will be reflected on the online charts when they are updated. The 2008 edition of the U.S. Figure Skating rulebook will also reflect this correction.

COMPULSORY MOVES

Skaters will be awarded one mark for technique.

Non-test: Open to skaters who have passed no US Figure Skating test.
No music; Duration: 1:00 MAX; 1/2 ice surface.

1. Connecting steps
2. One-foot spin – minimum 2 revolutions
3. Loop jump
4. Forward spiral
5. Waltz jump/Toe loop combination
6. Lunge

Compulsory Moves Continued:

Pre-Preliminary: Skaters who have passed Preliminary Freestyle test are ineligible.
No music; Duration: 1:00 MAX; 1/2 ice surface.

1. Sit spin - 3 revolutions minimum
2. Forward spiral
3. Jump combination – flip/loop
4. Single jump (no axel)
5. Connecting steps
6. One-foot spin – no change of position – minimum 3 revolutions

Preliminary: Skaters who have passed Pre-Juvenile Freestyle test are ineligible.
No music; Duration: 1:00 MAX; 1/2 ice surface.

1. Flip
2. Forward spiral or Ina Bauer
3. Camel spin/one foot spin – minimum 3 revolutions
4. Connecting steps
5. Sit spin – minimum 3 revolutions
6. Jump combination–2 single jumps (no change of foot, or turn in between, axel permitted)

Pre-Juvenile: Skaters who have passed Juvenile Freestyle test are ineligible.
No music; Duration: 1:15 MAX; 1/2 ice surface.

1. Axel
2. Backward to forward spiral
3. Double jump (no double axel permitted)
4. Connecting steps
5. Jump combination consisting of one double and one single, no change of foot or turn between.

Pre-Juv con't:

6. Combination spins with one change of foot and one change of position – minimum 3 revolutions in each position).

Juvenile: Skaters who have passed Intermediate Freestyle test are ineligible, 12 years and under as of May 25, 2007.

No music; Duration: 1:15 MAX; FULL ice surface.

1. Double loop
2. Circular footwork
3. Ina Bauer or spread eagle
4. Flying camel spin – minimum 4 revolutions
5. Jumps combination consisting of a double/double, or double/single (no change of foot and no turn in between)
6. Spin combination with one change of foot and one change of position – 4 revolutions minimum on each foot

Open Juvenile: Same as Juvenile except 13 years and older as of May 25, 2007.

Adult : Open to skaters 21 years and older.

No music; Duration: 1:00 MAX; FULL ice surface.

1. Two-foot spin – minimum 3 revolutions
2. Forward Edges – minimum 2 outside and 2 inside, skated consecutively
3. bunny Hop
4. Lunge
5. Forward inside Pivot

PARTNERED DANCE

Please refer to the eligibility rules at the front of the announcement. Dance teams/couples will be governed by the partner with the highest test passed and couple consists of a man and a lady.

Compulsory Dances:

Juvenile shall compete the Hickory Hoedown and the 14 Step

Intermediate shall compete the 14 Step and the American Waltz

Novice shall compete the American Waltz and the Killian

Junior shall compete the Cha-Cha Congelado

Senior shall compete the Austrian Waltz

Adult Championship shall compete the Paso Doble and Starlight Waltz

Open Masters shall compete the Cha-Cha Congelado

Adult Gold shall compete the Killian and the Starlight Waltz

Adult Pre-Gold shall compete the American Waltz and Paso Doble

Adult Silver shall compete the European Waltz and Rocker Foxtrot

Adult Pre-Silver shall compete the Willow Waltz and Foxtrot

Adult Bronze shall compete the Cha-Cha and Ten Fox

Adult Pre-Bronze shall compete the Dutch Waltz and Cha-Cha

LOW - HIGH

Low Division – Open to skaters who have not passed any Pre-Silver dance tests - Canasta Tango and Swing Dance.

High Division – Open to all skaters regardless of dance tests passed - Quickstep and American Waltz.

JUNIOR/SENIOR DANCE

Junior/Senior must be a 10 year age difference – only one member needs to meet the dance test qualifications.

Jr/Sr 1 – Open to skaters who have not passed any Pre-Silver Dance test. Dancers will skate Rhythm Blues; Fiesta Tango.

Jr/Sr 2 – Open to skaters who have passed Pre-Silver Dance or higher. Dancers will skate European Waltz; Foxtrot.

JUMP EVENT

Skaters will perform each jump in the order, as stated. Pre-Preliminary through Pre-Juvenile levels will skate on 1/2 (half) ice. All other levels will skate on full ice. Skaters will be given two opportunities to perform each jump and will be judged on the best one. Each level will compete as follows: the first skater will take the ice and attempt the first jump twice, pause and then attempt the second jump twice. This will be repeated until all the required jumps have been attempted and the next skater will then take the ice. Each judge will award one mark to each skater for all jumps completed overall

SHOWCASE

Open to all skaters Non-test and above. Qualifications to compete in a given level are the same as the requirements for the free skate event. Skaters will be awarded one mark for presentation. Interpretation, style and composition shall be factors in determining the mark given. Costumes should be appropriate to the theme of the music. Any props must be carried on and off the ice by the skater in less than 30 seconds. Men and ladies may compete against each other. There will be **no** separate Light Entertainment or Dramatic events.

Non-test through Pre-Juvenile - Duration 1:40 MAX

Juvenile through Novice – Duration 2:10 MAX

Junior through Senior - Duration 2:40 MAX

Open Adult Showcase – Duration 1:40 MAX (test requirements - must have passed Adult Pre-Bronze or higher)

SPINS EVENT

Three spins (except two spins for Adult Pre-Bronze level, as indicated below) to be skated in program format, no music. The required spins may be skated in any order with minimal connecting steps which will not be judged. Only the required spins in each level, as described below, may be performed. Emphasis is on the overall performance of each spin. Skaters will receive one mark from each judge for Technical Elements. Men and ladies may compete in the same event. All levels will skate on 1/2 ice; time listed is maximum time.
